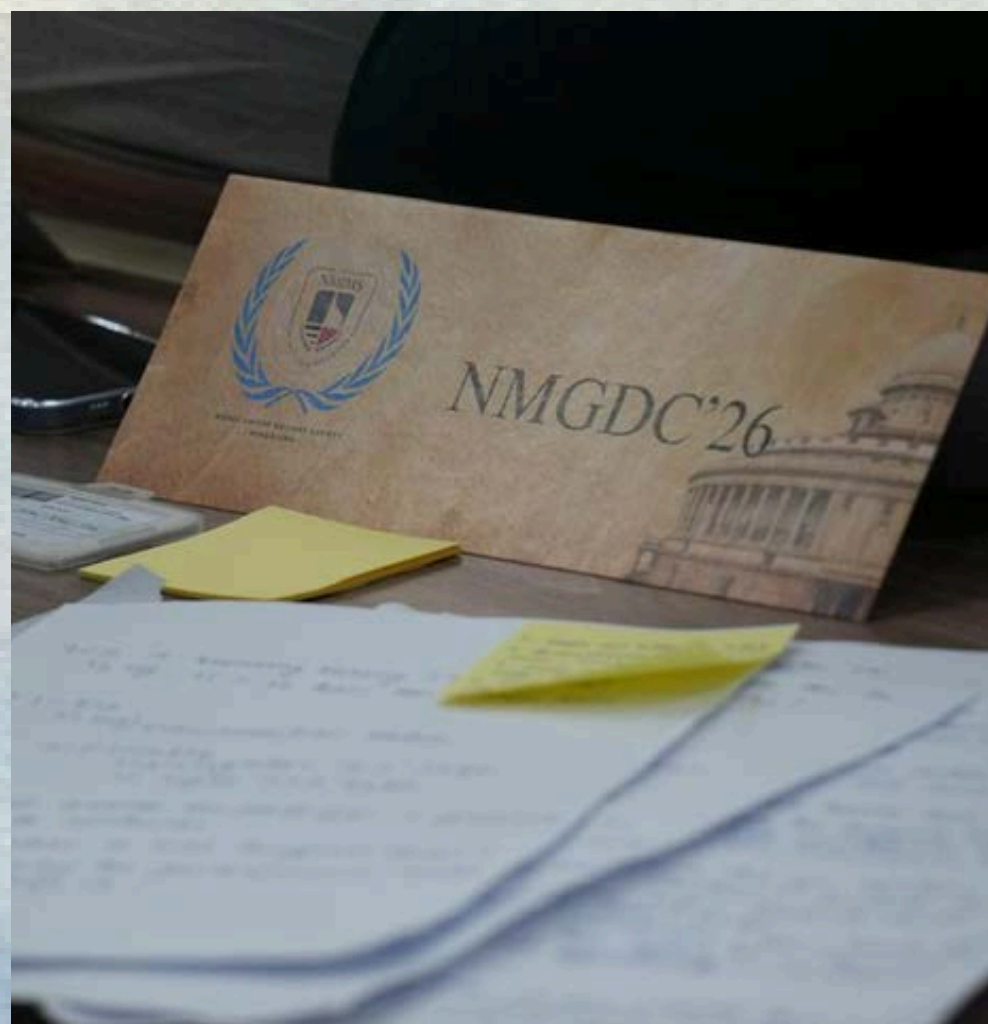

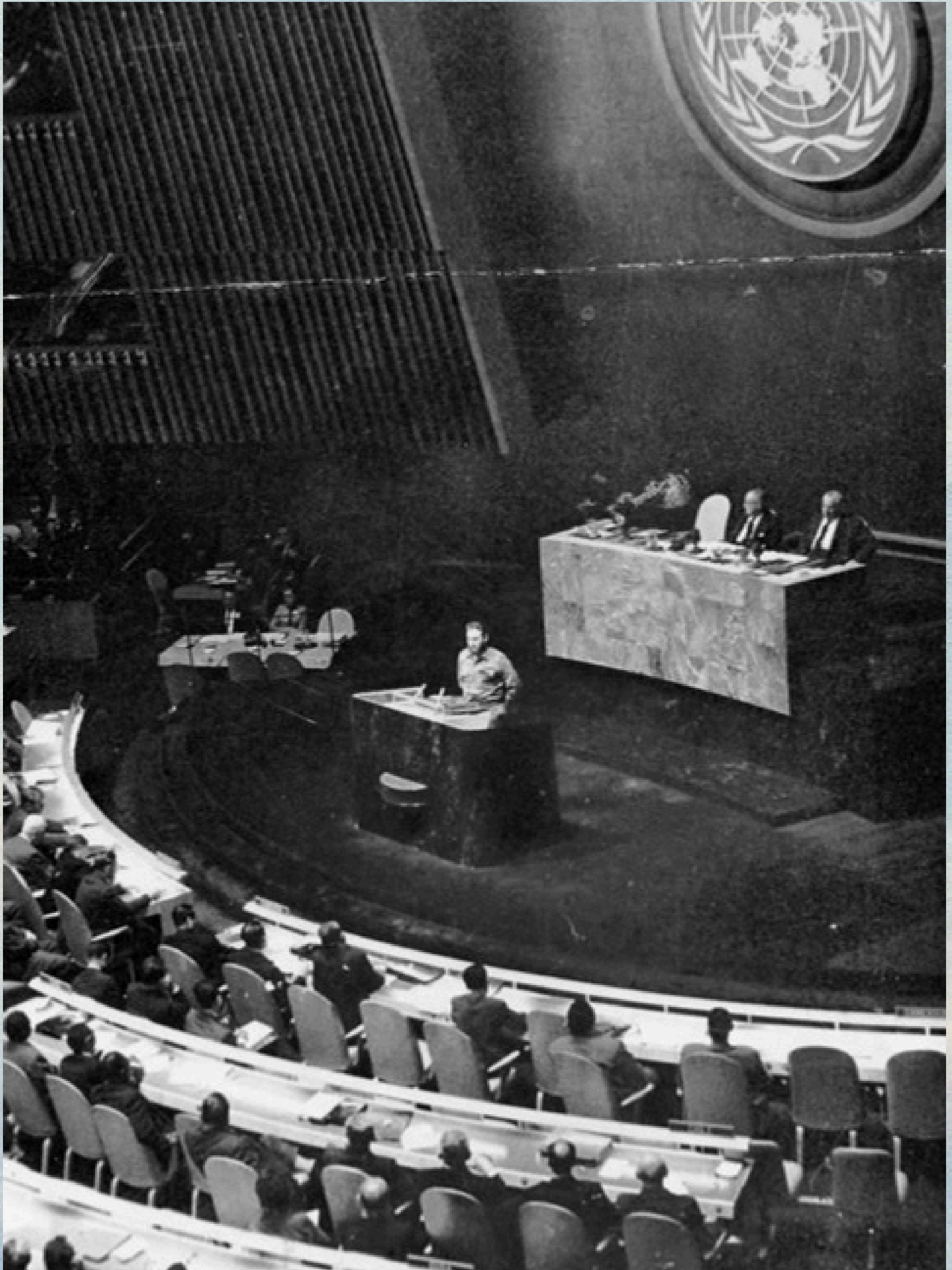
from the

COMMITTEES



UNSC

UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL



The Security Council has primary responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security. It has 15 Members, and each Member has one vote. Under the Charter of the United Nations, all Member States are obligated to comply with Council decisions. It takes the lead in determining the existence of a threat to the peace or act of aggression. It calls upon the parties to a dispute to settle it by peaceful means and recommends methods of adjustment or terms of settlement. In some cases, the Security Council can resort to imposing sanctions or even authorize the use of force to maintain or restore international peace and security.



UNHRC

UNITED NATIONS HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL



The Human Rights Council is an intergovernmental body within the United Nations system responsible for strengthening the promotion and protection of human rights around the globe and for addressing situations of human rights violations and making recommendations on them. It has the ability to discuss all thematic human rights issues and situations that require its attention throughout the year. It meets at the United Nations Office at Geneva (UNOG).



ICJ

INTERNATIONAL COURT OF JUSTICE

To this end the International Court of Justice (ICJ) settles legal disputes submitted to it by States, this is the contentious procedure. Secondly the Court gives advisory opinions on legal questions referred to it by authorized United Nations organs and specialized agencies. This is the advisory procedure. It functions in accordance with its Statute which forms an integral part of the Charter (Art. 92, UN Charter). The International Court of Justice is composed of 15 judges who are elected by the General Assembly and the Security Council for a nine year term of office. It has its seat in the Peace Palace at The Hague, The Netherlands.



AIPPM

ALL INDIA POLITICAL PARTIES MEET

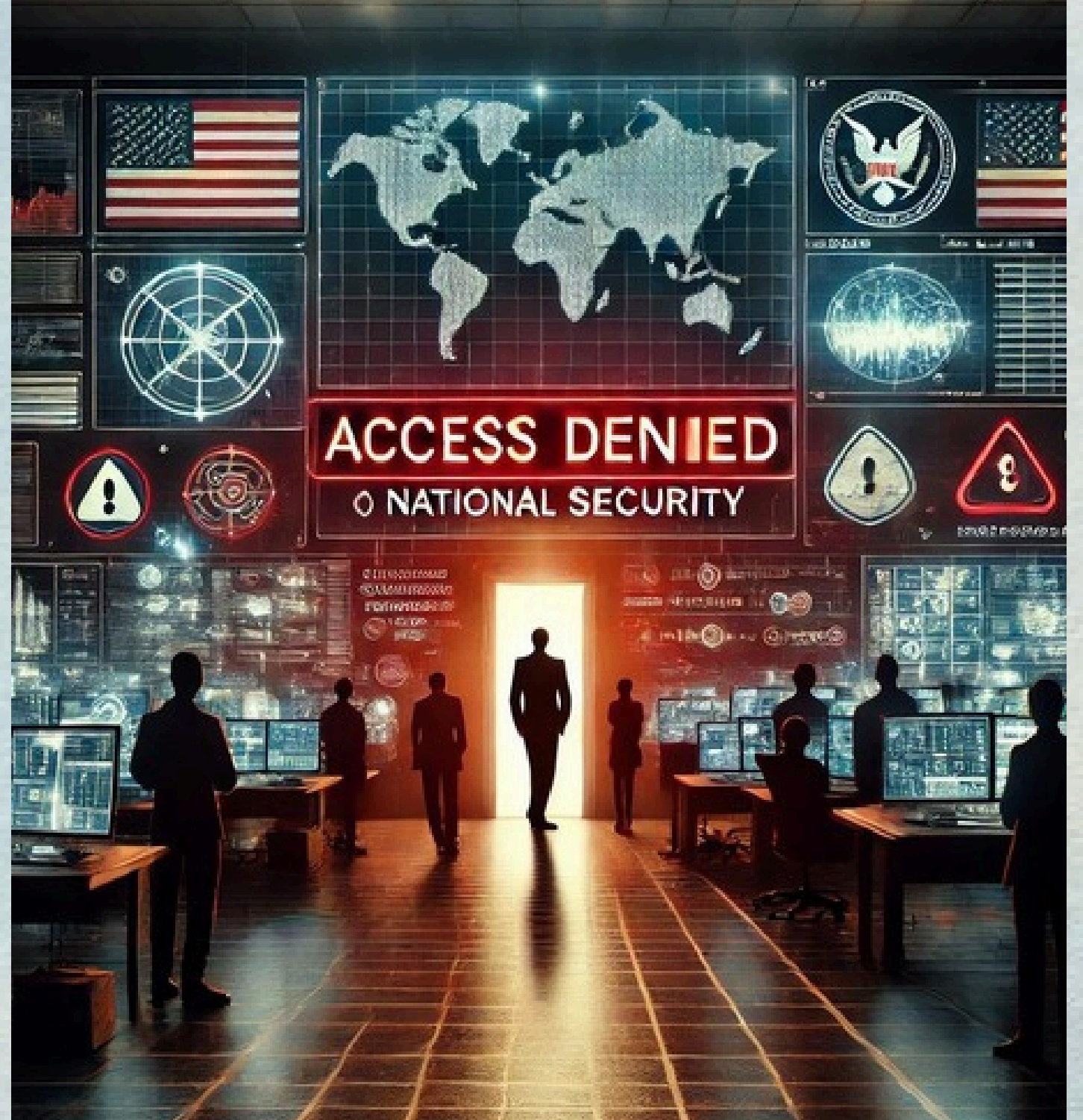


AIPPM is a specialized, non-technical committee in Model United Nations (MUN) conferences that simulates high-level political dialogue, focusing on Indian domestic issues. Participants represent specific Indian political leaders, MPs, or parties, arguing their assigned ideologies to debate national topics like policy, security, or social issues.

DISARMAMENT AND INTERNATIONAL SECURITY COMMITTEE



DISEC, is the First Committee of the UN General Assembly. It focuses on issues related to international peace and security, including disarmament, nuclear weapons, terrorism, cybersecurity, and arms control. It provides a platform for member states to discuss global security challenges and propose peaceful solutions. The committee aims to promote cooperation, stability, and the prevention of conflicts among nations.



Registration

REGISTRATION GUIDELINES

First-Come, First-Serve Basis:

Committee and country/portfolio allotments shall be made strictly on a first-come, first-serve basis, subject to availability and successful completion of registration formalities.

Preference Submission:

Delegates are required to indicate their committee and portfolio preferences at the time of registration. While the Organising Committee will make every effort to accommodate these preferences, final allotment shall remain at its sole discretion based on availability and suitability.

Confirmation of Seat:

A seat shall be considered confirmed only upon successful submission of the registration form and payment of the applicable delegate fee within the stipulated timeline.

Payment Deadline:

Failure to complete the payment within the prescribed time after provisional allotment may result in cancellation of the allotment and reassignment to another applicant.

Non-Transferability:

Registrations and portfolio allotments are non-transferable. Any request for change must be formally communicated to and approved by the Organising Committee.

Organising Committee's Authority:

The Organising Committee reserves the right to modify committee allocations, agenda specifics, or conference policies if required in the interest of the conference.

Refund Policy:

The delegate fee shall be non-refundable unless the conference is cancelled by the organisers.
